## News from the Board

1. Neil Feichtner gave the finance report. At the end of June, the balance of all checking and savings accounts was \$186,274.94. We have \$45,000 in CDs. The gross profit in June was \$41,022.66 with the total expenses being \$12,941.12. ASCA was in the black \$28,081.54 for the month of June.
2. Jennifer Jones gave the membership reports for May and June. May had 9 renewals, 9 non-renewals, and no new members. As of June 30, ASCA's total membership was 370, with 22 renewals, 24 non-renewals, and 1 new member.
3. Janye announced that any ASCA or staff member who traveled outside of the 26 counties of the Texas Pan-handle will need to isolate from ASCA for 14 days. She also announced ASCA's moving and relocating plans (see cover of newsletter).

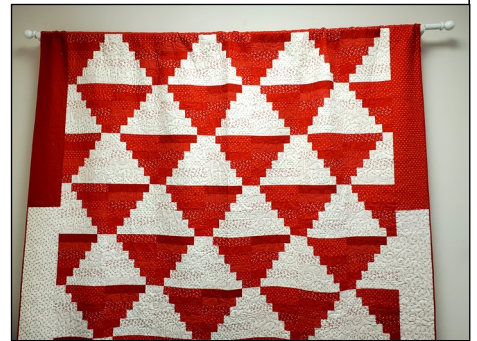

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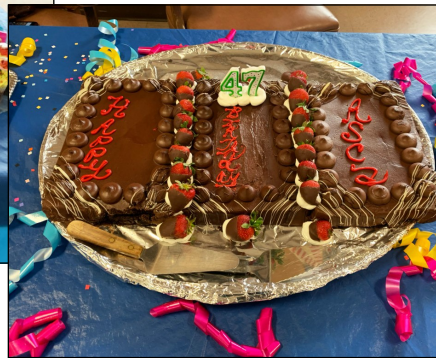

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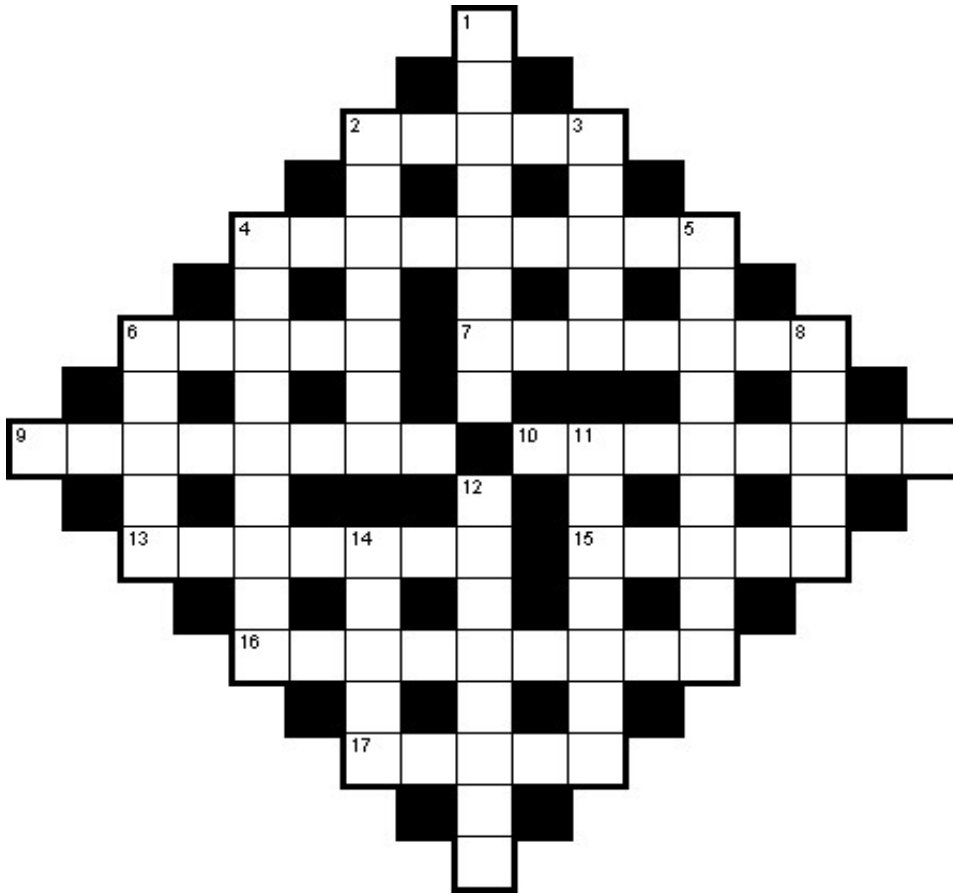
